




Prepared for: Seekers of the Lost

What We Are All About

Tyler is a sophomore in Lincoln. Near the end of the school year he began to show interest in spiritual things and started attending a Bible study led by a volunteer, Kevin. Through that study he started asking deep questions and attending a Campus Life club where he engaged with our staff, Jason. Jason and Tyler had lunch a few times, engaging in good conversations about life and God.

One evening a student leader, Seth, offered to give him a ride home. The 10 minute ride home became an hour and a half long conversation about God. From their conversation Tyler decided to attend summer camp with Seth and Jason. It was at that camp that Tyler become a Christ-follower!

Somewhere between 64-85% of Christ-followers became believers before the age of 18. These believers were often introduced to Christ through a peer or an adult who invested in their life.

Youth for Christ exists to reach students through outreaches to middle and high schools (Campus Life), at the juvenile detention center (Juvenile Justice), through life-changing experiences (YFCamp and Project Serve) and to disciple them as they in turn reach others for Christ (Leadership Development).

History

Since the 1950's Lincoln Area Youth for Christ has impacted thousands of students with the life-changing message of Jesus Christ. Beginning with youth rallies in the fifties and evolving into Campus Life Clubs that served as discipleship clubs for new believers when we officially incorporated in 1969. As the prevalence of youth rallies diminished Campus Life clubs were, and still are, outreach programs to lost, hurting students that meet at or near high school and middle school campuses.

Campus Life High School

Campus Life reaches young people on high school campuses through:

- Weekly high energy large group gatherings (club)
- Student leadership development and outreach training for Christian students
- · Small group discipleship
- · One-on-one appointments
- Trips/events (ski trip, KC trip, Battle of the Schools)
- YFCamp (summer camp experiences)

Our ministry team consists of volunteers, part-time staff, and full-time staff who passionately walk onto school campuses to develop Christ centered relationships with non-believers.

Juvenile Justice

This new initiative of YFC will reach students who are serving a sentence at the Lancaster Youth Services Center. Each night 60-80 students are housed at the facility. While serving time they attend school and have their basic needs met with little outside involvement and very little faith based support.

At the detention facility we hope to:

- Meet with students one on one.
- Serve as chaplain by coordinating volunteers to provide mentoring, individual Bible studies and discipleship
- Provide club programing
- Initiate an innovative archery program with the Nebraska Game and Parks to teach institutionalized students a lifelong skill and connect them with a mentor.
- Develop relationships with judges, parole officers, etc. to best meet student needs.

Leadership Development

This year marks the first year we have truly benefited from a focus on helping Campus Life students make the transition to college. Last year we launched a program, *Alumni Leadership*, to accompany students who became believers through Campus Life continue their faith journey into their first year of college. This first group of students led to nine students joining our *Internship* program.

One of our staff members, Chelsea Marine, is now focused fulltime on the Alumni Leadership, Internship, and Volunteer programs. She continually pours into these believers and is focused on growing our ministry team.

God has laid before us a clear mission, a mission to go where students are and bring them the message of the Gospel. We do this by intentionally entering their world and getting to know them through weekly clubs, events, trips, small groups, and oneon-one appointments.

Expansion: Campus Life

Campus Life will be returning to three different middle schools in the Lincoln Public Schools. At *Lux* middle school, we recently received approval from the administration to host club in the gym before school and have some established relationships with teachers. *Goodrich* Middle School is reopening this year after having been closed for renovation for several years. The opportunity here is to build a strong foundational outreach as the school is opening. Initiating outreach at *Culler* Middle school marks an intentional outreach to one of the most difficult middle schools in town. We are currently building a community support team to start this ministry.


Begin: Juvenile Justice

We are initiating an outreach at the Lancaster Youth Services Center. Students from a 13 county region who are awaiting their trial, serving shorter sentences, or detained for other reasons spend 24 hours a day in this facility. Currently, there are a handful of volunteers running Bible studies. We will come in and support these volunteers as well as bring new volunteers from partner churches, provide chaplaincy services, and initiate the National Archer in the Schools Program.

Solidification: Campus Life

This beginning of the year project also includes some funding for the solidification of the ministry. We are doing this by moving to a new database system for donor communication and providing training for current and new staff on the recruitment and mobilization of volunteers at all 14 outreach sites. How will my gift be used?

We have renewed our commitment to using your gifts wisely so that as many students can be reached as possible. Our goal is to keep administrative costs below 15%.


Giving to the Campus Life Foundation is as easy as adding the following wording to your estate papers:
